LES IS MORE

Consider this Bible passage: "Now as they went on their way, Jesus entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me." But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her. (Luke 10:38-42 NRSV)"

If we were to ask people if they were more like Martha or Mary, the vast majority would say "Martha" – with a look of guilt on their faces and several "shoulds" coming out of their mouths – "I should meditate more often" – "I should be more regular in my devotions" – "I should slow down" – etc., etc.

But consider now this story from the desert fathers (4th Century):

A brother came to visit St. Sylvanus at Mount Sinai. When he saw the other brothers working hard, he said to the old man, "Do not work for food that perishes, for Mary has chosen the good part."

Then the old man called to his disciple: "Zachary, give this brother a book, and put him in an empty cell."

Now when it was time to eat, the brother kept looking out of the door to see if someone would call him for the meal. But nobody called him, so he got up, went to the old man, and asked: "Abba, didn't the brothers eat today?"

The old man replied: "Of course we did!" "Then why didn't you call me?" he asked.

The old man replied: "You are a spiritual person, and do not need that type of food; but since we are earthly, we want to eat, and that's why we work. Indeed you have chosen the good part reading all day long, and not wanting to eat earthly food,"

When the brother heard this he repented: "Forgive me, Abba."

Then the old man said to him: "Mary certainly needed Martha, and it is really by Martha's help that Mary is praised."




When we look at a globe or map, we see many different cities and countries. We are citizens of the place where we live. But we also hold another citizenship! Where?
