NEWS FROM THE SESSION

The Session held its regular Stated Meeting on September 16, 2018 following worship. Here are some highlights from the meeting.

Through the end of August, regular income is 3% behind budget for the year but ahead of last year's giving by 2%. Total income (all sources) is ahead of this year's budget by 11%. Expenses are down due to very little spending in Capital Expenditures this year. Because of the positive financial situation, the Business Team voted to increase staff salaries by 2% and to call a congregational meeting to approve the change to the terms of the Pastor's call. These increases were not given at the end of 2017 and the decision was made at that time to look at this in mid-2018. The Session would like to thank the congregation for continuing to give faithfully to support the operation of the Church.

The Angaza Nuru ministry will be presented to the congregation on October 14 during fellowship coffee.

Appreciation is expressed to Edwina Ulmer for all her hard work "behind the scenes" to keep our church running so efficiently.

The October Session meeting will be on October 21.
